If you would like to discuss a programme idea with a commissioning editor, you must find out as much as possible about the kind of material they are looking for, eg look at the website listed. This is to ensure that your proposal is relevant to the commissioning editor's remit. You may not submit a proposal to any department that has already turned it down. BECTU members may register scripts with the union's Script Registration Service: see www.bectu.org.uk for details

Freelance/permanent employment

If you are applying to see people to discuss employment prospects, enclose your CV.
